

SENIOR CHECKLIST

Not everything on this list will apply to you.

- Retake the ACT or SAT? (watch the registration deadlines)
- Dual enrollment
- NCAA Division I & II College Athletics– make sure you meet core course eligibility requirements.
- College Visits
- Scholarships
 - Apply for scholarships as they become available on time (due dates are different for each one).
 - Regularly check Announcements & Bulletin Board
 - Look online in Counselor’s Corner section on H.S. page
 - Check for scholarships at where your parents work.
 - Check for scholarships at the places you frequent
 - (I.E. Insurance companies, Banks/Credit Unions, Clubs, Churches)
- Make sure you are on track to graduate
 - Credits (minimum of 25)
 - Core classes (English, Math, Science, Social Studies, P.E., Computers)
 - Service Hours (40 hours documented)
- Apply to colleges (If you wish to qualify for scholarships apply early.)
 - Request transcripts from Parchment for each college applied to.
 - ACT and SAT scores sent to each college (usually requested when registering for the test)
- FAFSA
 - Watch for special events where you can get help

- ___ Order Cap & Gown
- ___ Order Yearbook
- ___ Make final decision about which college attending
- ___ Go through all college materials sent
- ___ Send in all necessary paperwork and fees
- ___ Assume Nothing...If you have a question ASK
- ___ AP tests - register and pay test fee, prepare well for the test
- ___ Tell the counselors about scholarships you are being given so they can be announced on Awards Night – forms are available. Please DO NOT ASSUME that we know where you are going and what scholarships you have been awarded just because you mentioned it.
- ___ Senior Awards Night (May 18)
- ___ Make sure to follow instructions carefully so that you may receive your money in a timely manner. Instructions will be given to you at Senior Awards Night.
- ___ Prom
- ___ Schedule classes for Fall
- ___ Graduate
- ___ Celebrate (be smart about it)
- ___ CLEP - As soon as you're registered for the college of your choice, ask them about their CLEP program. Every college has one, but their rules may vary. Most have a specific department and specific timetable to get this done. It saves money and time.
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
